#### **WORLD TEACHERS' DAY**

On behalf of the ICES staff, thank you for the beverages and treats on October 5 – this was a wonderful surprise that was deeply appreciated by everyone.

#### **TEACHING FOR TRANSFORMATION**

This year we are partnering with local agencies monthly to collect various items to support their ministries. In October we collected non-perishables for the Interfaith Foodbank and in November we will be collecting socks and toques for Streets Alive. December will continue to have a focus on funds for Compassion Canada and in January we hope to partner with My City Care. Another food drive will take place in the spring as this is a time of significant need at the Food Bank.

#### **SCHOOL THEME & CHAPELS**

Our first theme chapel using the new time and chapel groups went well. The throughline for this focus was *creation enjoying*. In the staff skit, the students were introduced to a new character – a butterfly – who was transformed from a lowly caterpillar into a beautiful butterfly. The theme chapels will be as follows:
