Rock Your Mocs is a nation-wide day of recognition, awareness, and appreciation for traditional Indigenous culture, specifically, traditional footwear – moccasins.

Traditionally moccasins were always worn as indoor and outdoor shoes. Moccasins were worn to protect peoples' feet from the land and keep them warm and/or dry. You don't have to go and buy moccasins in order to help celebrate Rock Your Mocs.

We will be doing a few activities that day to learn about the importance of moccasins to Indigenous culture and discussing how we as Image Bearers of God, are called to love and respect all people and all cultures.

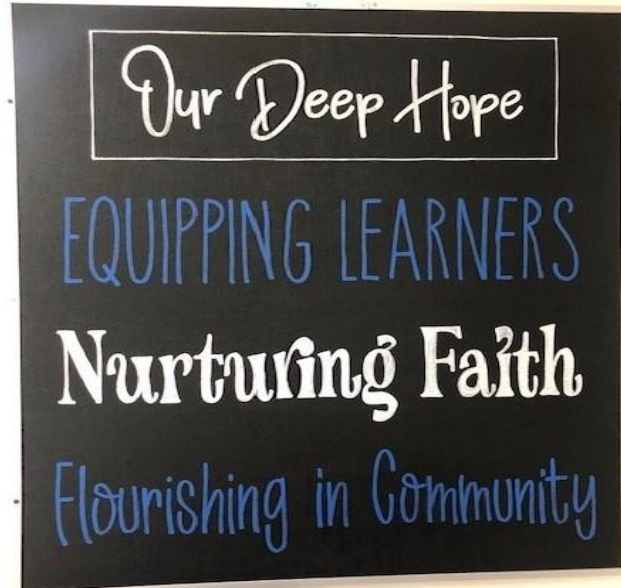
### COMPASSION CANADA FUNDRAISING
